President's Report - 2024/2025

Season 2024/2025 was another successful season for the club capped off with our 66th premiership at the Burra, with our 2nd XI taking the E grade premiership honours. This is on the back of many great years at the Burra having also won the H grade premiership across the previous season.

However, the season did begin with the sudden passing of our dear friend & club man Ian Scholefield, who passed away in October after a sudden illness. Schoey was a life member at the club, and more recently was the clubs historian, spending countless hours working on the clubs records and statistics. He had spent over 50+ years at the Burra, and made a huge mark on this club during that time. He will be sorely missed, and although he may not physically be with us anymore, we will do all we can to keep his strong legacy alive for many years to come.

Hartwell Pitch Redevelopment

Thanks to the tireless efforts of true clubman Patrick Sowersby during the off-season, we successfully secured a grant of approximately \$4,000 from the Australian Sport Infrastructure Fund. This funding went directly toward the replacement of the Hartwell East pitch, resulting in a brand-new playing surface for our club.

Building on this momentum, the amazing efforts mentioned above also led to further support from the Boroondara Council, who took the initiative themselves to fully refurbish the Hartwell West pitch as well. We sincerely thank Luke Casey from the Council for his support in helping make this happen. As a result of these combined efforts, we now have two brand-new pitches at both Hartwell ovals - an incredible outcome that will benefit the club and our community for years to come. We would like to also thank ASTE (Melbourne Tennis Court Construction Specialists) who were our partner in laying the new pitch, for their amazing professionalism during the process and the quality end product.

On Field Performance

This season, Burwood District Cricket Club fielded 6 sides across all competitions, with 3 Saturday Senior sides, 2 Tuesday T20 sides and Sunday Veterans.

Unfortunately we did have to reassess our junior cricket program and decided this season to focus on the Woolworths Blasts program, targeting entry level kids between the ages of 4-10. Further details on this will be provided in the Junior section.

Senior Cricket

For our senior teams, season 2024/2025 began with a series of opportunities and challenges following changes in the association during the offseason. With Heatherdale and Vermont cricket clubs respectively moving away from BHRDCA, the opportunity arose for our 1st XI to play in the Peter White Shield, after many years away from shield cricket. Although a daunting task on paper, the boys were ready for the challenge.

As for our 2nd XI and 3rd XI, both these teams continued where they left off. Both teams competed strongly again this year, reaching the finals for their respective competition. For our 2nd XI, they took it all the way, claiming the E Grade Premiership.

There were a large number of individual club milestones achieved this season. In particular, congratulations to Patrick Sowersby (7000 runs) and Shivanay Goundan (3000 runs) for BDCC.

There were also players who were recognised by the BHRDCA for their efforts throughout the year, including Krishnan Venkatachalam (E Grade - Bowling), Jake Evans (F Grade - Batting), Sam Dabhi (F Grade - Bowling) and our 2nd XI team for their Premiership success. Congratulations to you all.

Junior Cricket

This season, we pivoted our junior strategy following multiple changes across our Junior cricket membership base. With many kids moving on, we decided to focus our attention on the woolworths blasts program, targeting the youngest crop of our next budding cricketers.

This season, we were fortunate to have Abhishek Pratap lead our Blasts program. Working closely with Sharon Lynas from Cricket Victoria, Abhi was able to set up our system with a 8 week program in October/November and a Pop-Up Plasts program in February. Both of these programs were great successes, and we are grateful for all the kids and their families for taking part.

Finally, we also want to take this opportunity to those that got behind our Burra Annual raffle. Thanks to all the tickets purchased, we were able to raise ~\$2K for the club, helping us immensely towards raising funds for future investments at the club.

While we didn't host many large-scale social events during the season, it was incredibly rewarding to see so many of the boys spending time together at the clubrooms after games. These informal moments were invaluable in building team morale and strengthening the bonds off the field - connections that undoubtedly carried over into stronger performances on the field.

Looking Ahead

Looking ahead towards the next 12 months, it's a very exciting time to be part of the Burra. As we are a few years away from our 100th anniversary, we start to focus our attention towards the centenary celebrations. Embarking on a milestone like this, is a massive moment for the club, and therefore we will be ensuring that this is more just than a 1 year celebration, however a lead up.

- Continuing discussions with the Boroondara council regarding the redevelopment of Hartwell Rooms and the overall Sportsground. We strive to get this off the ground, with a target completion of Mid 2027, in time for our 100th anniversary
- Setting up a new range of merchandise as part of our Centenary Launch across 2026-2028
- Attracting a mix of new sponsors and social sponsors to help build club awareness and support
- Recruitment of new players for both our Junior and Blasts program

We also want to take this opportunity to thank 2 legends of this club, who have both decided to move back to India after many years at Burwood District. Abhishek Pratap and Parag Jagtap have both been instrumental in the growth of this club over the last 5 years, and we are so grateful for their service during this time. Junior Cricket Report - 2024/2025

The 2024/25 season marked a year of consolidation and development for our junior cricket program.

Unlike the past four to five years, the club did not field any junior competition teams. With the departure of several players from our junior ranks at the end of the 2023/24 season—primarily due to the need to find age-appropriate cricket elsewhere—and without sufficient numbers to form competitive sides, we made the decision to focus solely on the Woolworths Blast program.

The Woolworths Blast program continued to run on Thursday evenings from 5:00 to 6:00 pm before senior cricket training, providing a fun, skills-based introduction to cricket for our youngest participants. The program was delivered in two halves. The first half consisted of eight pre-Christmas sessions, held from October 10 to November 28. These sessions were led by Cricket Victoria staff, supported by club volunteers. We had 10 children attend during this period.

The second half of the program ran from February 6 to 27 after the summer break, with four sessions delivered entirely by club volunteers. Almost all of the children from the first half returned, joined by Viaansh (our youngest Burra of the season at just four years old) and Asher. We are incredibly proud of these twelve enthusiastic junior Burras for beginning their cricket journeys with us. It was fantastic to see the energy and excitement they brought to each session.

A heartfelt thank you goes to all the parents, grandparents, and families who spent many hours driving the kids to sessions, attending, and even volunteering with us during drills. You are all part of the Burra family. Your ongoing support is essential, and we look forward to growing our junior ranks together in the seasons ahead.

Thank you to the club members who volunteered their time to run the program—Pat, Dhanur, Parag, Pratik, Jay, Sam, and Ifra. And the biggest thanks to Burwood District's heart and soul: **Bede Allsopp**, who was there at 4:30 pm for every session—taking out the equipment, setting up, working with the kids, and packing everything away. His commitment, energy, and time spent engaging with our youngest Burras played a major role in the program's success.

Running Blast alongside our senior training on Thursdays continues to set us apart from many other clubs in the district and fosters a strong connection between our junior and senior programs.

While we didn't field junior teams this season, the club remains committed to rebuilding its junior playing base in the years ahead. The Woolworths Blast program provides a strong foundation for this, and we hope to see many of these young players progress into junior teams in the future.

Finally, thank you to our club presidents, **Nazza and Arj**, and our 2024/25 committee for their incredible support behind the scenes in planning and managing the program.

Treasurer's Report - 2024/2025

After previous years of turning over strong profits, the 2024/25 season presented a significant financial challenge, culminating in a loss of \$5,977. This result was largely attributed to two key expenditures: a substantial investment of \$3,410 in new pitches at Hartwell Sports Ground, crucial for the continued quality of our playing facilities, and \$3,615 in umpiring fees, an essential cost of competing in the Peter White Shield BHRDCA competition. These expenses coupled with an increase in costs such as equipment (i.e., balls) and council fees significantly impacted our financial performance for the year.

The committee sees some of these additional expenditures as investment costs for the future. This included the new pitches at Hartwell Sports Ground as an investment in the future of the club and largely in part to the hard work of Patrick Sowersby were able to get Cricket Victoria grants and the Boroondara Council on board to substantially lessen the financial cost. On top of this we have looked to keep investing in our merchandise to maintain stock on hand for sale in the coming years.

Our partnership with Masuri will continue into the 2025/26 season, providing our senior and junior teams with the Burwood District CC merchandise range. We have also been looking for additional options, to ensure our players have access to high-quality apparel. This includes a recent purchase of playing caps from new provider Rovia Sports. The committee will be carefully evaluating the profitability of our merchandise sales in light of the past season's financial results to ensure it remains a sustainable revenue stream for the club.

Membership prices were slightly increased with the adjustments made in the 2024/25 season to accommodate increased competition fees, however we did not properly factor in the umpiring fees that we would have to incur throughout the season. We continued to offer early bird options for both senior and junior memberships to encourage early sign-ups. While this offer was taken up by 15 members before the 2024/25 season commenced, the committee will be engaging in thorough discussions with players to review the current playing fees and explore strategies to enhance membership engagement and overall revenue, particularly in light of the significant infrastructure and operational costs incurred.

The invaluable support of our major sponsors – Roaring Success, Treadcare, and Chemist Warehouse – will be even more critical in the 2025/26 season. Their generous contributions in the past years have been vital, and we will be proactively working with them to explore opportunities for continued and potentially increased support to help offset the impact of the essential pitch upgrades and umpiring fees, ensuring our ability to continue investing in our players and club infrastructure. I would like to personally thank them all for their ongoing commitment to the club and the important role they have played in the 2024/25 season.

The social connection fostered in our club rooms post-training and on match days remains a part of our club culture, and we will continue to encourage this in the upcoming season. Our key events for the 2024/25 season were a great success, including the Season Launch at Far Side Beers, providing an excellent opportunity to connect as a club before the season began. We also hosted another always competitive Treadcare Cup, and for the second year in a row our whole-club presentation afternoon at the Burwood District Bowls Club. We thank all those who organised and participated in these important club events.

A significant highlight of the 2024/25 season was the outstanding performance of our Second XI, who clinched the premiership title in a thrilling final against St Davids. Despite unpredictable weather conditions adding an extra layer of drama, we were able to secure victory by 5 wickets. This achievement is a testament to the talent and dedication within our club members and provides us with a fantastic boost for all Burwood District CC teams to build on in 2025/26.

Even as investments in our facilities and increased operational costs created financial challenges in the 2024/25 season, the Second XI's premiership win showcased our overall improvement on the field as a club as we progress towards our centenary in 2028.

For the 2025/26 season, the committee will look at efforts such as sponsorships, grants and additional fund raising drives (similar to this year's raffle) to increase our revenue streams, in order to combat the financial challenges everyone has had to encounter in the past few years. We are committed to supporting our players and maximising playing opportunities for all our members.

In conclusion, I extend my sincere thanks to the committee, players, and wider members of Burwood District CC for their continued support and cooperation throughout the 2024/25 season. I would also like to again acknowledge the exceptional contribution of Narayanan Ramakrishnan in the help he has provided me to make the job of treasurer more manageable.
